

O-TEAM MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS Overview Document 2014

Brief Description

Membership on the LaGrange College Orientation Team (O-Team) has long been considered one of the institution's most prized student leadership positions. O-Team members represent the College and welcome incoming students as well as their families to campus during summer orientation sessions and First Week. The O-Team sets the tone for how all incoming students start their college experience! Namely, O-Team members must be available to set up facilities, greet incoming students, mentor individual O-Team student groups, assist with course registration, attend workshops, and be available for questions at all times during orientations and First Week. We are looking for individuals who love the institution and have the time, energy, and dedication to serve our incoming students.

Requirements

- Cumulative GPA and most recent semester GPA of 2.6
- Be a student in good standing and registered for 2014 Fall semester classes
- Permit the College permission to review any institutional disciplinary records that may exist
- Be available to work at least two orientation sessions and all of First Week (unless written permission is provided by the Dean of Students) this includes excluding yourself from all work-related duties and spending the entire days working on O-Team tasks . . .
 - Orientation Session I: June 11 (evening), June 12 (all day), & June 13 (until noon)
 - Orientation Session II: June 18 (evening), June 19 (all day), & June 20 (until noon)
 - Orientation Session III: July 13 (evening), July 14 (all day), & July 15 (until noon)
 - Orientation Session IV: Aug. 12 (evening), Aug. 13 (all day), & Aug. 14 (until noon)
 - First Week: August 23 August 26
- Be able to attend at least two mandatory training sessions
 - Session One: either Tuesday, April 22 (11:15 am) or Thursday, April 24 (11:15 am)
 - Session Two: either Tuesday, April 29 (11:15 am) or Thursday, May 1 (11:15 am)

How to Apply

- Type and complete the 2014 O-Team Application and attach required essay.
- Get the O-Team Recommendation Form completed and signed by either your Cornerstone instructor or your current advisors.
- Print and submit the typed application to the appropriately labeled box in Smith Hall, Room 119 (you may include the recommendation form if it is given back to you) Due by 5 pm on March 26, 2014.
- When you submit your application, sign up for an interview time (<u>interviews are not required for</u> <u>individuals who have previously served on the O-Team</u>). Interviews will be conducted on Wednesday, April 9 and Thursday, April 10, 2014.
- If applicable, arrive promptly for your interview (business casual attire suggested).
